#### What Do I Put Into the Organics Cart?

The reason Organics Carts are so important is that they help divert tons of materials away from our landfills which saves costs and is better for the environment. Here is a list to help you utilize your cart efficiently. Thank you for helping us provide you with the best possible service.

#### Organics Acceptable List

- Grass and weed clippings
- Shrubs and tree prunings (less than 4" in diameter)
- Leaves, plants and flowers
- Food scraps and food soiled paper products

#### Non-acceptable Organics List

- No household garbage
- No plastic bags
- No dirt or rocks
- No overloading lid must be closed

# **Superheros Save the World And So Can You...**

## Be a Superhero and Help Keep Hazardous Waste Out of Landfills...

As of February 9th, state law requires the following items must be kept out of your *garbage* cart.

- Household batteries for example: 9 volt, AA, AAA, C, D and button batteries. For Dublin residents AVI has a special service, you may use your recycling cart to recycle your household batteries and save a trip to the household hazardous waste facility. Please see inset at right for instructions.
- Fluorescent light bulbs and other mercury containing lamps
- Mercury devices for example: thermostats, thermometers, pilot light sensors, electrical switches & relays and gauges

To properly dispose of batteries, fluorescent lights, thermometers and other mercury devices

### Glass is an Awesome Recyclable

When glass is recycled, water consumption is reduced by 50%, minimizing waste by 79% and air pollution by 14%. Glass can be recycled indefinitely.

### Wanted: Old Paint to Good Homes

Did you know that 85%-90% of the material that comes in to a HHW facility gets either recycled or reused? Take latex paint, for example. The HHW program gives away thousands of gallons of recycled latex paint free to the public, local government agencies, schools, churches, clubs, community organizations, and non-profits. ## Special Recycling Service ~Dublin Residents Only~

Please place your household "dry-cell" batteries (i.e. alkaline, cell phone, flashlight or watch, etc.) in a clear, heavyduty, zip-type plastic bag. Place the sealed plastic bag in your black lid recycling cart.
