Proper Sorting Requirements

Residents are required under SB 1383 and local ordinances to sort organic waste from landfill material. To avoid service delays, extra fees, and citations, please follow the following guidelines:

- √ Place food scraps, food-soiled paper, and yard trimmings in your green compost cart.
 - **No plastic, glass, or metal should ever go in the green cart.**
- √ Place clean/dry paper in your blue recycling cart.
- √ Be careful not to contaminate the materials in your green and blue carts with items that do not belong.

DO NOT Bag Recyclables!
Recyclables must be **CLEAN, DRY, and LOOSE** to be recycled.

Preventing Litter on Your Service Day

- √ Do not overload your carts. The lids should close completely.
- √ Shredded paper can be put into the compost cart in a closed paper bag. It cannot go into the recycling bin.
- √ Bag packaging peanuts and secure the bag before putting it into the garbage.
- √ Place broken items in the middle of the appropriate cart (food and beverage containers in the recycling cart and dishes in the garbage cart).
- √ Do not wedge or compact materials into your carts. Doing so will prevent your cart from being fully emptied when serviced.
- √ Make sure carts are at least 3 feet apart from each other and other objects so they can be lifted and emptied properly.
- √ Avoid setting out carts backwards. Place carts at the curb with the wheels and handles facing the curb. This allows cart lids to fully open and the material inside to fall freely into the truck.

Updating Your Service Level



Are you a Dublin resident who has a 96 or 64-gallon garbage cart?

Many residents who properly source separate their food waste and recyclables from the garbage find that they can get by with a smaller garbage cart.

Reducing the size of your garbage cart to a 32-gallon cart saves you money on your bill. Maximizing the use of your recycling and compost cart by properly sorting your waste helps to protect the planet and support Dublin's local waste reduction goals.

Reuse Spotlight

As of January 2022, California law AB 1276 requires all retail food facilities and food delivery platforms to provide disposable foodware accessories and condiments upon request only.

Foodware items covered by the law include all single-use utensils, straws, chopsticks, stirrers, and condiment cups and packets, including those made from bioplastics, compostable plastic, bamboo, and paper.



Bringing Your Own Reusables is Safe & Allowed!

California state law (AB 619) allows consumers to bring their own clean, reusable food and beverage containers for takeout orders and leftovers.

Following all sanitary guidelines, reusable containers can be filled by food facility staff or the consumer.
